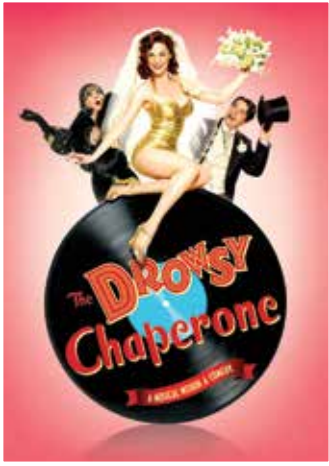

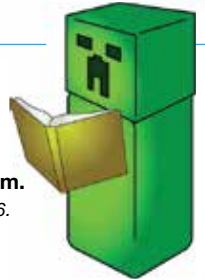

Long Island Reads (One Island – One book) is an island-wide reading initiative during which book lovers in Nassau and Suffolk counties read the same book, participate in discussions of the selection, and enjoy book-related events. This year's book selection is *The Manor: Three Centuries at a Slave Plantation on Long Island* by Mac Griswold. The author tells the story of one of the earliest plantations in the North, dependent for nearly two centuries upon the labor of African-American slaves, Native Americans, and indentured servants.

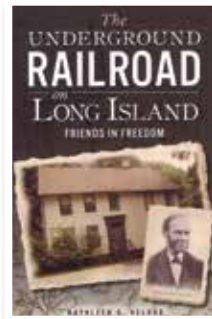


Underground Railroad
